Update from WAKA: (Waitomo Arotahi Kahui Ako - cluster of Schools and ECE / Kohanga Reo)

The staff call back day brought together 200 teachers and support staff from our local area to Piopio College. The focus on Restorative Practice also covered important areas of transitions and the need to understand and identify particular needs of students to better cater for their learning.

The ceiling in B-Block was replaced due to mold which posed a potential Health and Safety risk. The new ceiling has been replaced, insulated and repainted

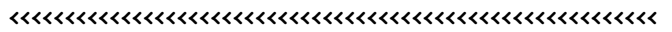

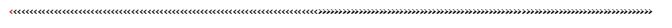
