Community Awareness:

There has been a lot of notice in the media about this deadly virus.

Coronavirus - What is it? The [pneumonia-like coronavirus has now killed 132 people](#) around the world, mostly in China, and as of Wednesday morning there were 6000

confirmed cases. Wuhan (China) was believed to be the place of origin of the virus. There are currently no proven therapies for the novel coronavirus, which authorities believe originated from a seafood market in the Chinese city of Wuhan. Researchers are racing to produce a vaccine for the deadly coronavirus. In NZ there have been reported cases in Rotorua but these are still to be confirmed.

The Ministry of Education has released the following details.

As always anyone who is unwell should not be at school. If you have a particular concern about any child, student or staff member, please urge parents or the staff member to contact Healthline at **0800 611 116** or their GP for medical advice. Healthline has translators and interpreters available **24/7 in 150 languages** and they do have Mandarin and Cantonese speaking staff available.

If a student still attends school while showing symptoms the Principal of a state school can preclude them if they believe on reasonable grounds they may have a communicable disease (Section 19 Education Act). The student has to stay away for the infectious period of the specific disease.

For any staff member or student who may be at high risk of exposure because they have recently been to China or have been in close contact with someone confirmed with the virus, we ask that the staff member or parent/caregiver of the student delay the start of their school year for 14 days and voluntarily stay away.

Te Kura Rautau have an up to date Pandemic and Emergency Management Plan in case a notification is received and a course of action is required.
