13th February 2024 Kia ora e te whanau,

Next Wednesday, the kura will travel in two groups (because of the times leaving) to attend the Whakamaumaharatanga o te Paahuatanga O Apakura ki Rangiaowhia. This will be a memorial service to commemorate 160 years of this event occurring. This is an opportunity for our students and whaanau to learn about our local histories which had a significant impact. Ngaati Apakura Runanga Trust are organizing the event and 'see this as an opportunity to reconcile our history, create awareness, strengthen our resilience, grow understanding and develop stronger healthier relationships into the future'. A paanui will be sent out over the next day or so whaanau are fully informed of times each group is leaving and what time we will be returning. This will be a one day event. If you wish to join us, please contact your child's kaiako. There are limited seats available as preference will be given to our students first. We are hopeful all whaanau will allow their tamariki to travel with us to Rangiaowhia. There will be no cost to students or whaanau for travelling on the vans or bus. Lunches for students will be provided by the kura.

A Bus Code of Conduct form will be sent home for whaanau and your child to read and sign. The form is to let you all know of expectations when travelling on buses at all times. We are very thankful that last year the bus operators reported that students from Te Kura Rautau did not cause any damage to any of their vehicles and positive behaviour was of a high standard. School Policies:

The list of School Policies and Procedures is very comprehensive and covers all legislative and compliance rules and expectations. We currently use a platform called School Docs. This organisation represents more than 1800 schools throughout NZ and keeps our kura up to date on changes.

Next weeks Paanui, we will show you how you as whaanau can access this policy platform so you can always check and be reassured that we are following guidelines as required. From time to time, we will post on our Paanui a policy up for review or is current to what is happening.

The current Policy up for review: So we wish to consult with our community is as follows: (Please contact us at the kura office if there are areas you would like to see adjusted)

Te Tiriti o Waitangi

Te Tiriti o Waitangi is one of Aotearoa New Zealand's founding documents and represents the binding contract between Māori and the Crown. Centennial Park School – Te Kura Rautau recognises our role and responsibility to honour and give effect to te Tiriti o Waitangi.

Under the Education and Training Act 2020, a primary objective of the board of Centennial Park School – Te Kura Rautau is giving effect to te Tiriti o Waitangi. We do this by:

- working to ensure our plans, policies, and local curriculum reflect local tikanga Māori, mātauranga Māori, and te ao Māori
- taking all reasonable steps to make instruction available in tikanga Māori and te reo Māori
- achieving <u>equitable outcomes</u> for Māori students
- providing opportunities for learners to appreciate the importance of te Tiriti o Waitangi and te reo Māori.

Centennial Park School – Te Kura Rautau works from the principles of partnership, protection, and participation to meet our obligations under te Tiriti o Waitangi. These principles reflect the three articles of te Tiriti.

Partnership

Centennial Park School – Te Kura Rautau aims to work in partnership with our local Māori community to support rangatiratanga/self-determination. We actively seek the guidance of our local Māori community to help us better meet the needs of our ākonga Māori and ensure they experience educational success as Māori.

We consult with our local Māori community on the development of our charter/strategic plan to make sure it reflects and upholds appropriate tikanga Māori and te ao Māori. We seek opportunities to collaborate with Māori to invest in, develop, and deliver Māori-medium learning (NELP Priority 2).

Protection

Centennial Park School – Te Kura Rautau actively protects and upholds mātauranga Māori, te reo Māori, and tikanga Māori, and ensures they are meaningfully incorporated into the everyday life of our school (NELP Objective 5). We actively engage with **Ka Hikitia Ka Hāpaitia** .

We take all reasonable steps to make instruction available in te reo Māori and tikanga Māori.

We support our kaiako to build their teaching capability, knowledge, and skills in te reo Māori and tikanga Māori. We provide opportunities for kaiako to develop their understanding and practice of culturally responsive teaching that takes into account ākonga contexts (NELP Priority 6).

Participation

Centennial Park School – Te Kura Rautau has high aspirations for every student. We encourage the participation and engagement of students and their whānau in all aspects of school life.

Our relationships with our school community help us meet the needs of all students and sustain their identities, languages, and cultures. The participation of whānau and our wider Māori community actively informs the way we design and deliver education to ensure ākonga Māori experience educational success as Māori (NELP Priority 2).

This policy aligns with **NELP** Objective 1: Learners at the Centre, Objective 2: Barrier Free Access, and Objective 3: Quality Teaching and Leadership.



Centennial Park School – Bus Code of Conduct 2024

This Code of Conduct is between:	
(student), (their caregiver), The Bus/Transport	
Operator and Te Kuiti Transport Network Group (fund holder), and Te Kura Rautau – Centennial Park School.	
The caregiver and the student should ensure they have read and understood this document, which is to be adhered to for tafety of the bus driver and all students travelling on the school bus.	:he
, (student), agree to abide by the behavioural expectations described below:	
When I am a seated passenger, I will remain in my seat for the whole journey. I will not eat on the bus or throw anything inside or out of the bus. I will not VAPE or SMOKE on the bus If I am a standing passenger, I will stand quietly and not push or move around the bus. I will respect other students and their property at all times (this includes pushing, verbal or physical abuse, or any other behaviour that may distract the driver). I will use socially acceptable language when conversing with the driver and/or other students and I will not speak at a volume that may distract the driver. I will respect the property of the bus operator at all times (e.g. refraining from standing on seats or vandalising the vehicle in any way). I will not engage in any behaviour that could put the driver or other students at risk. I will observe the requirements and instructions of the bus driver and the teacher/s responsible for bus duty at all times. I understand that any damage I cause to the bus will result in my caregiver being billed for the cost of repairs I will wear a seatbelt correctly if the bus is fitted with them.	/
he safety and comfort of everyone on the bus depends on a standard of behaviour and consideration for others that is expected in the classroom. We hope that caregivers will support the school in maintaining these standards of behaviour.	
The student will be placed on daily report for one week and the caregiver will be notified immediately If no improvement is evident after one week, an interview will be arranged between the student, aregiver(s), and school. If there is still no improvement, travel on a school bus will be withdrawn, and the caregiver will be equired to find alternative transport to get the student to school. In extreme cases of misbehaviour, the privilege of travelling on a school bus could be withdrawn mmediately.
