Our Swimming Sports results are further in the Paanui. Our normal swimming program continues whilst it is still warm enough, so please continue to encourage your tamariki to swim for now.

Last week our senior classes visited the Science Roadshow at the High School and were amazed at what science demonstrations were happening. There are some images of some of the activities our tamariki participated in later in this Paanui. The feedback from the students were extremely positive and they mentioned it was well worth the visit.

Our school lunch program is going well, and we are very thankful to be able to provide kai to all our tamariki every day. This means whaanau do not need to prepare kai. The lunch is a healthy option that is monitored by nutritionists to ensure the correct amount of 'goodies' are in the meals. We have plenty of fruit for morning tea so all we need is for tamariki to have a good breakfast and they'll be ready for kura. As the cooler seasons approach, our 'Breakfast Club' is available for students before kura starts for a 'top up' of either toast or a warm milo. There is no cost for this.

Our drainage issues on the large playing field along Park Road are hopefully sorted. The main pipe has been cleared and water is now directed away. It's early days and this will still be prone to heavy downpours, but at least we should not have a lake forming for long periods of time causing potential risks to tamariki.

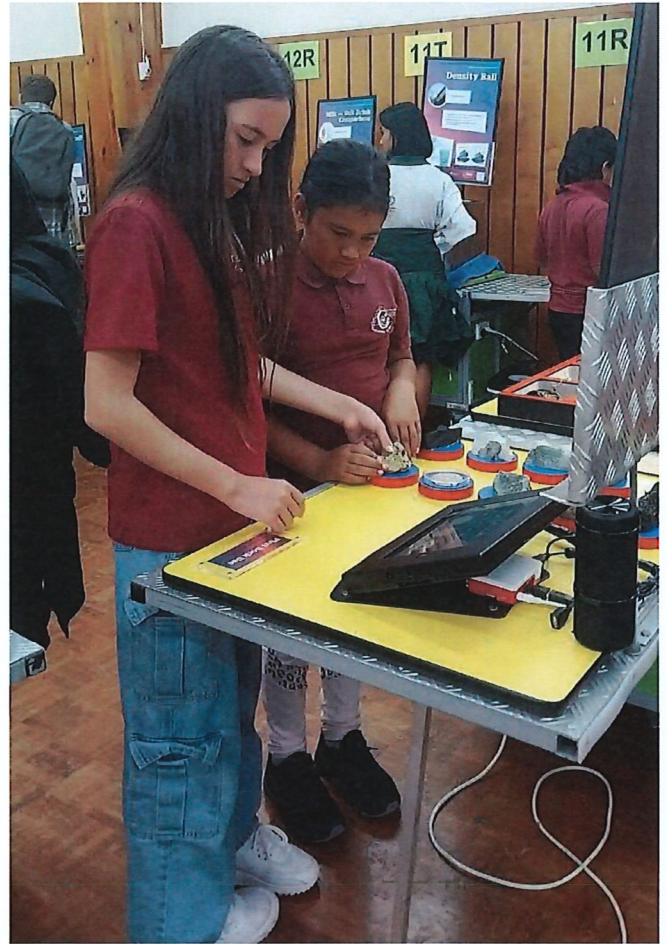
Meet and Greet – Tatsuno Japan update:

Thank you to those who regularly contact the kura to update us on appointments or illnesses.

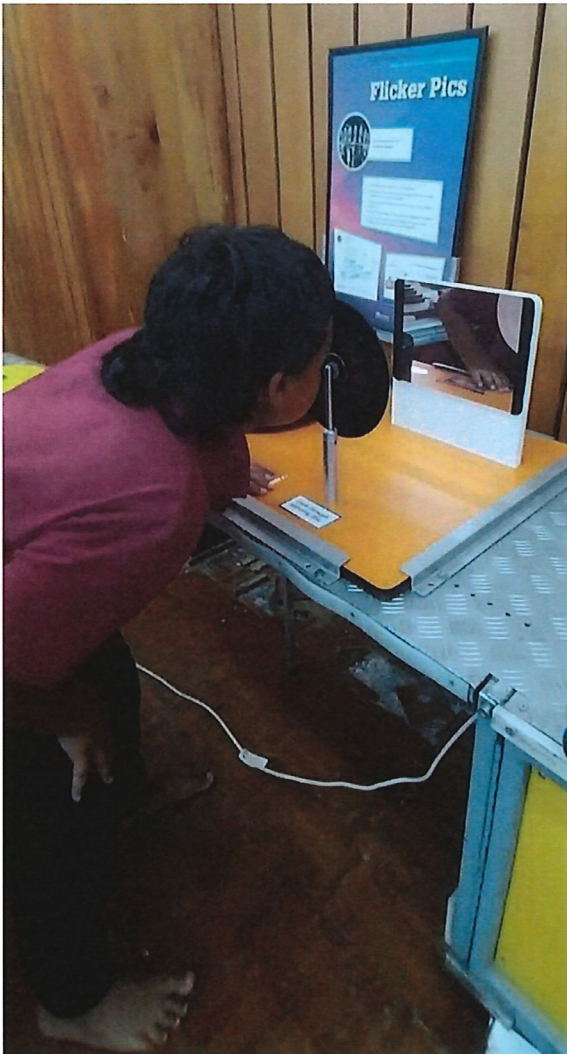

A moment in time... History in New Zealand

25th March 2020: New Zealand enters nationwide lockdown in fight against covid 19: At 11.59 pm on Wednesday 25 March 2020, New Zealand entered a nationwide lockdown to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus around the country.

28th March 2004: Maori Television launched: A dawn pōwhiri at Māori Television's new offices in Newmarket, Auckland, was covered in the first transmission next day.

31st March 1864: Rewi's last stand: The last battle of the Waikato War began when the spearhead of a strong British force charged an apparently weak Māori position at Ōrākau, south-east of Te Awamutu. After two frontal assaults failed, the British besieged the pā.
