There is an important notice about emails in the community section of this panui. Please be aware of this to keep yourselves safe and secure. If you are unsure, use the contact numbers to call for support.






The Ka Ora, Ka Ako Healthy School Lunches Program will be starting here at Te Kura Rautau.

Please find attached a copy of the Nutrition guidelines for whanau to look through. There are examples of a menu that our tamariki will be having however the menu will be tailored to meet what they would prefer and as long as it fits the criteria. There will be some adjusting to fine tune the menu. During cooler times such as winter, lunches will be heated so that is something to look forward to.

If your child has special dietary requirements, please let the kura know so we can cater for your child.

The Healthy Lunches Program means whanau do not provide their child's lunch. The kura will do this and it comes at no cost to whanau. We will have fruit to top up as required which is already readily available.





Te Hunga Tauwhiro i te Kura Social Workers in Schools (SWiS)

Social workers in schools (SWiS) work in a confidential setting and in partnership with whanau/families and kura/schools so that tamariki/children can learn, grow and thrive. SWiS work primarily with tamariki in Years 1-8 (ages 5-12), in selected schools.

- We identify the obstacles that prevent tamariki from learning.
- We work with schools and families to help tamariki to overcome these obstacles.
- We help keep tamariki safe from harm.
- We can link tamariki and their whanau with other agencies and support where needed.
- SWiS is a free service.
- Principals, teachers, and whanau can refer tamariki to SWiS services, or tamariki can self-refer.
- Whanau have a right to decline or withdraw their tamariki from SWiS services at any time.

An important notice from the Education Service Desk



What is happening?

Multiple phishing email campaigns are targeting the New Zealand school sector

Phishing emails try to trick the recipient to give away information like passwords, usernames, bank account or credit card details. These emails can appear to come from trusted organisations or persons that you know and can look very convincing.

Phishing emails that have been reported recently include:

- Emails enticing people to click on links and enter their usernames to access shared documents
- · Emails regarding money transfers and transactions
- Emails advising users to click on links to 'upgrade' their system or increase the size of their mailbox.

The following tips will help you identify these emails and will help prevent:

- The loss of sensitive information
- The installation of malware on school computers.
- Your account or school network being 'hacked' or taken over



Is there anything I need to do?

Our advice is:

- Before responding to an email, ask yourself, "Am I expecting an email from this person or
 organisation?" If the email looks like it is from someone you know, telephone the sender to
 check whether they really sent the email. Do not reply or click on links/attachments within these
 email
- Phishing senders may try to create a sense of urgency or fear. Often, they will try tactics like telling you that your account has been hacked, your password has been stolen, or your bank details need to be 'verified' urgently. If an email sender is asking you to perform an urgent action, stop and ask yourself if the request is legitimate.
- Always follow your school's normal finance or payroll processes.
- If your school has a process for reporting and handling phishing emails you should review that process and ensure that your school staff know what to do if they either:
 - Identify that they have received a phishing email.
 - Clicked on a link from a phishing email and/or entered any sensitive information.
- If a user at your school is tricked into giving away their username and password, then part of
 your process should guide that user to immediately change their password to a completely
 new password.

Contact your **school's ICT provider** in the first instance if you suspect that a user account in your school has been compromised by phishing.
