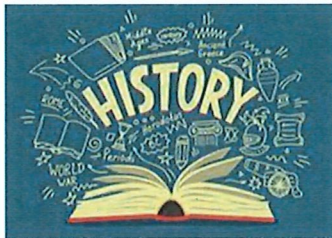

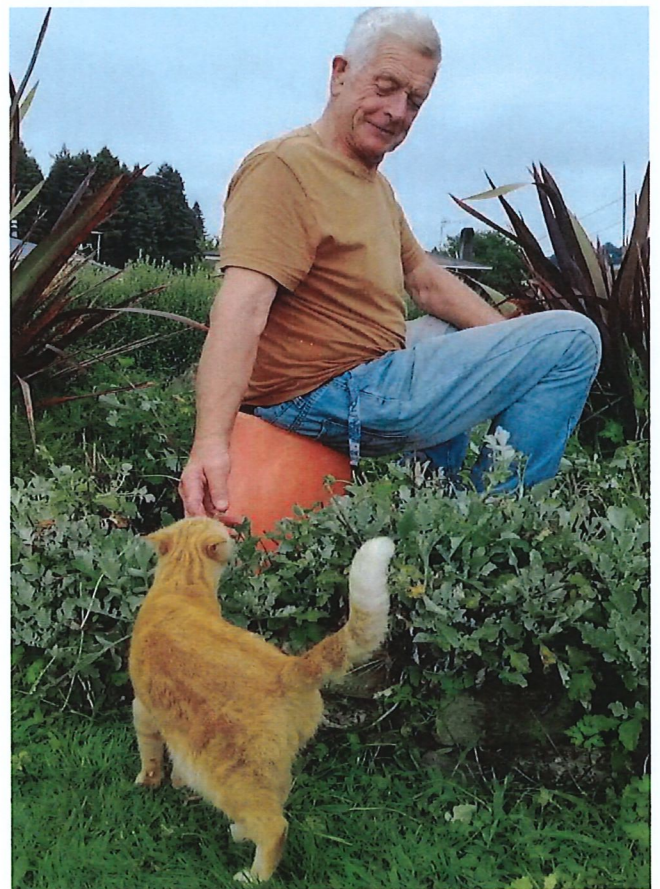
### **1<sup>st</sup> April 1965** Teal becomes Air New Zealand:

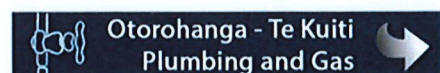
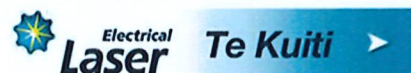
