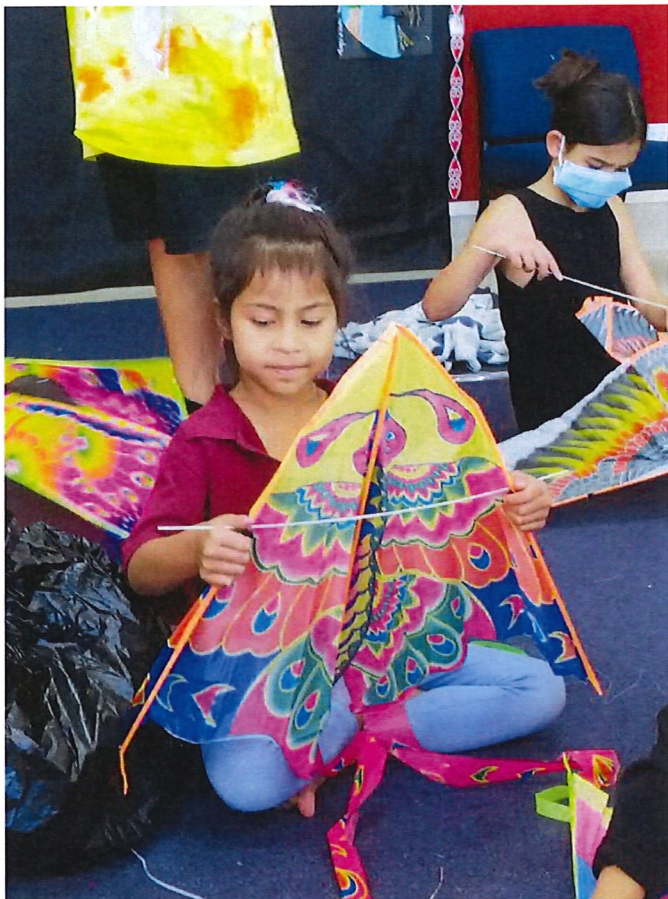
Well done to the staff, whaanau and especially our tamariki.

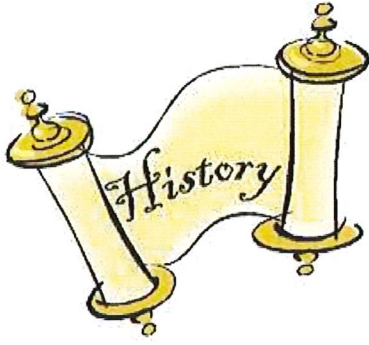
A sea of students spread out over the field created a wonderful scene of happiness and friendship as they helped each other to fly kites as part of the Matariki Celebrations

History: A moment in time...

June 25th 1860: First Maaori King

The Māori King movement came into existence in the late 1850s as an attempt to unite the tribes, prevent land sales and make laws for Māori. Pōtatau Te Wherowhero became the first Māori King in 1858, but died two years later.

June 28th 1881: First woman Pharmacist

Elizabeth Robinson of Christchurch was the first woman to register as a pharmacist under a registration system established by the Pharmacy Act 1880.

July 1st 1988: Bastion Point was returned

The government announced that it had agreed to the Waitangi Tribunal's recommendation that Takaparawhā (Bastion Point) on the southern shore of Auckland's Waitematā Harbour be returned to local iwi Ngāti Whātua.

July 6th 1923: Main trunk line train disaster

The Auckland-Wellington express ploughed into a huge slip that had slumped across the tracks at Ōngarue, north of Taumarunui in King Country.
