



A moment in time – Our History

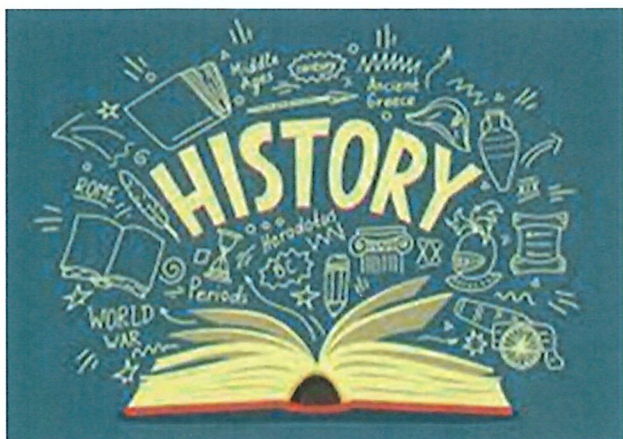
30th August 1903: Rotorua Geyser erupts suddenly: Guide Joseph Warbrick and three tourists were killed instantly when the Waimangu geyser erupted unexpectedly

2nd Sept 1960: Golden hour for Kiwi runners in Rome: New Zealand sport enjoyed one of its greatest days in Rome's Olympic Stadium. Peter Snell won the 800 m and Murray Halberg won the 5000 m

2nd Sept 1972: NZ Rowing Eight-win Gold at Olympics: In 2008 the well-known sports writer Joseph Romanos chose the victory of the 1972 rowing eight as the best team performance by New Zealanders at an Olympic Games.

3rd Sept 1939: New Zealand declares war on Germany: Alongside Britain and Australia, New Zealand was one of the first countries to become involved in the global conflict precipitated by Germany's invasion of Poland on 1 September

3rd Sept 1958: First open hearted surgery took place in NZ. Pioneering heart surgeon Brian Barratt-Boyes performed the surgery using a heart-lung bypass machine. The procedure, at Green Lane Hospital in Auckland, was carried out on an 11-year-old girl with a hole in her heart.

A recent meeting with the Ministry of Education on Bus Transport has highlighted a number of areas we need to be very mindful of.

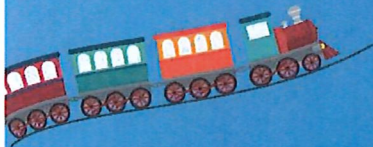
Health & Safety:

- 1. When buses pick-up or drop off students at kura: What are the risks involved for students and the road? What are the risks for those crossing the road at that time? What are the risks of whaanau parking near this area? What are the risks for those cars reversing out whilst bus is parked up either picking up or dropping off students?*
- 2. The wearing of masks for all students is now compulsory - meaning everyone on a bus must wear a mask unless they have a special exemption that identifies they are not required to wear a mask.*
