Curriculum changes are happening in the sector:

It is critical our education system continues to evolve and remains focussed on delivering equitable and excellent outcomes for all Aotearoa New Zealand's tamariki and young people. A five-year programme to refresh our NZ National Curriculum is underway, aimed at ensuring all ākonga experience rich and responsive learning. Our National Curriculum comprises The New Zealand Curriculum and Te Marautanga o Aotearoa.

These changes will also honour our past and obligations to Te Tiriti o Waitangi.

New resources will be developed to support teaching and learning, including leadership guidance and sets of teaching and learning materials for kaiako.

Curriculum leads from the MOE and other agencies will help support our kura to use the refreshed national curriculum and to design our localised curriculum. At present Te Kura Rautau is undertaking the initial process of focus on things we are currently doing or know. We now need whaanau and tamariki to help design the curriculum together with staff so we can all best meet the needs of our community.

We are keen to host a consultation hui with whaanau and community to explore these areas and learning opportunities. With the limitations of Level 2 Delta Covid, we may need to be creative in the way we reach out to our whaanau, unless Level 1 comes along very soon. We are keen to have this actioned before the end of the year. What are your thoughts? What are your ideas? What are you thinking about the learning going forward?

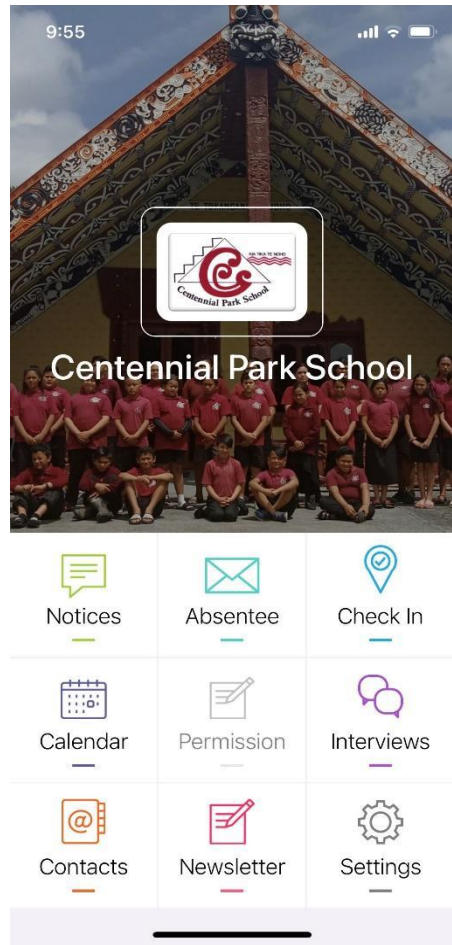
