15th Sept 1969: First steel produced from local iron-sands: New Zealand Steel's Glenbrook mill, near Waiuku, south of Auckland, produced iron and steel from local ironsand (titanomagnetite) shipped from areas like Taharoa for the first time. In 2020 ironsand and coal were being used to produce about 650,000 tonnes of steel a year.

16th Sept 1905: 'Originals' kick off All Black tradition: The first fully representative New Zealand rugby team to tour the northern hemisphere was known as the 'Originals'. They won 34 of their 35 matches and popularized both the haka and the 'All Blacks' nickname.

17th Sept 1941: Flogging and Whipping abolished: As well as (temporarily) doing away with capital punishment for murder, the Crimes Amendment Act 1941 abolished judicial provision for flogging and whipping.

12th Sept 1981: Flour bomb Test, ends Springbok Tour: The third and deciding rugby test at Eden Park, Auckland, is best remembered for the flares and flour bombs dropped onto the playing field. Outside the ground, violence erupted on an unprecedented scale.

13th Sept 1933: NZ's first women MP elected: The Labour Party's Elizabeth McCombs became New Zealand's first female Member of Parliament, winning a by-election in the Lyttelton seat caused by the death of her husband, James McCombs.

Protection Framework update

On Monday 12 September the Government announced from 11:59 pm on 12 September 2022, the COVID-19 Protection Framework (the 'traffic lights') would be removed.

The government also announced that only people who test positive for COVID-19 will be required to isolate for seven days. Household contacts are recommended to take a RAT test every day for five days. So long as they test negative, they will be able to go about daily life as normal. Household contacts isolating can follow the new self-isolation guidelines on 13 September. If they test negative and are asymptomatic, they do not need to self-isolate.
