The Ministry of Education have recently released the Literacy & Communication and Maths Strategy called 'The Common Practice Model'. The first part of this concept is to deliver equity and excellence in Literacy, communication and Math teaching and learning. This forms part of the bigger picture of the 'refresh of the New Zealand Curriculum. The concept is to provide clarity and direction for these learning areas from early learning such as in pre-school through to the end of secondary school. For ākonga, learning occurs in rich and diverse ways. This builds and adds value to what we have been focused on over the past few years with links to creating space for all forms of knowledge to be experienced, especially where cultural identities are valued. Our value our community involvement and participation to give us direction which will also be supported by evidence and research. The timeline for this is to start in 2024 and phased in over the next 5 years.

Our attendance rate dropped off last week. In most cases the reasons were genuine for things like illness and tangihanga. There are a small number however that are having more regular non-attendance challenges that will need to be addressed. Please whaanau, work with us so your tamariki are able to be at kura to maximize their learning as much as possible. Learning about New Zealand History – A moment in time:

Sept 14th 1972: Te taenga mai o te petihana reo Māori – Arrival of the Māori language petition: On 14 September 1972, a petition was delivered to Parliament which challenged politicians to prioritise saving te reo Māori.

Sept 15th 1969: First steel produced from local ironsand: New Zealand Steel's Glenbrook mill, near Waiuku, south of Auckland, produced iron and steel from local ironsand (titanomagnetite) for the first time. In 2020 ironsand and coal were being used to produce about 650,000 tonnes of steel a year.

Sept 16th 1905: 'Originals' kick of All Black tradition: The first fully representative New Zealand rugby team to tour the northern hemisphere was known as the 'Originals'. They won 34 of their 35 matches and popularised both the haka and the 'All Blacks' nickname.
