Safety Crossing the Road:

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A moment in time – Our History

30th October 1865: Native Land Court created: The Native Land Court was one of the key products of the Native Lands Act 1865. It enabled the conversion of traditional communal landholdings into individual titles, making it much easier for Pākehā to purchase Māori land.

30th October 1918: Massive prohibition petition presented to Parliament: Prohibition supporters presented Parliament with a petition containing more than 240,000 signatures demanding an end to the manufacture and sale of alcohol in New Zealand.

31st October 2015: All Blacks win Rugby World Cup for 3rd time: The All Blacks defeated Australia 34-17 at London's Twickenham stadium to become the first team to win back-to-back Rugby World Cup competitions, and the first to win the title three times.

Our girls will be trained by a fully qualified self defence teacher.

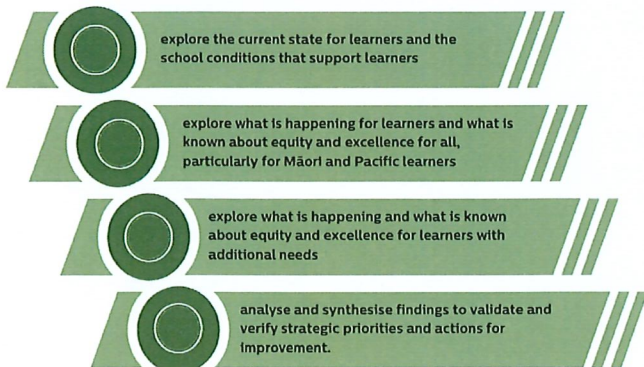
This will be a timely course as we lead into the end of year holidays and will help encourage our girls to be safe at all times

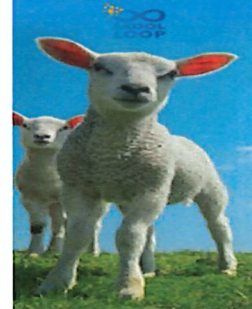
