Safety Crossing the Road:

We still see a small number of whaanau not crossing when the road patrol wardens are on. Please note whaanau, you are giving a mixed message to our younger tamariki

Good Safe Practice: Please whaanau – Use the controlled pedestrian crossing when it is operating. It is out on road patrol every afternoon and this is the busiest time for our tamariki to get across the road from the kura. We are still noticing a smaller number of whaanau crossing the road where the bus stops as it is the most convenient for them. The potential of this being a major problem will occur if a young child see's the whaanau across the road and then just runs out onto the road as they will be excited to see their parent or caregiver can lead to a major accident. Please help support our wardens and keep everyone safe.



A moment in time - Our History

<u>1st November 1898:</u> Old Age Pensions Act becomes Law: A world first, the Act gave a small means-tested pension to elderly people with few assets who were 'of good moral character'. It was one of the major achievements of Richard Seddon's Liberal government.

<u>2nd November 1868:</u> NZ becomes the first country to adopt a standard time: On 2 November 1868, New Zealand discarded its numerous local times and became the first country to regulate its time in relation to Greenwich mean time (GMT)

<u>3rd November 1886:</u> Birth of Anchor Butter: From a dairy factory at Pukekura, Waikato, Henry Reynolds launched Anchor butter. The brand name, allegedly inspired by a tattoo on the arm of one of his workers, would become one of this country's best-known trademarks.

4th November 1930: Phar Lap wins the Melbourne Cup: Ridden by Jimmy Pike, the New Zealand-bred (but Australian-owned) wonder-horse beat Second Wind by two lengths to claim one of his greatest victories


Skin cancer is the most common cancer in New Zealand

Most skin cancers are treated by your GP or skin specialist. A much smaller number need treatment at hospital.

Each year in Aotearoa New Zealand:

- An estimated 90,000 nonmelanoma skin cancers are diagnosed, with an estimated health care cost of \$129.4 million
- About 2,800 invasive melanomas are diagnosed, with estimated health care costs of \$54.5 million
- Over 4,000 people are found to have in-situ melanoma (melanoma that has not spread to other parts of the body)

By 2025 the total cost of skin cancer treatment is expected to grow to \$295 million




KI-O-RAHI FESTIVAL


